	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Locate the countries of Europe-match capital cities to their countries. Follow the capital cities activity from Digimaps.</li><li>• Where is Germany in the world? Pupils locate Germany on a map of the world and the capital city, Berlin, using 6 figure grid references. They identify the countries that border it. They write the name of the country and capital city of these countries.</li><li>• What physical characteristics does Germany have? Use a map/atlas to identify and list the main characteristics of the country. Which two rivers flow into the sea? Which sea? Where is the Black Forest? Which river flows through Bill Quay? Which sea does it flow into? What are the main mountain ranges?</li><li>• What is the climate of Germany like? How does it compare to the UK? Pupils create graphs. Why are the climates similar?</li><li>• Focus on Hamburg-ask pupils to create 2 digital maps at different scales to show the location and layout of Hamburg.</li><li>• Using the internet, pupils research Hamburg and create a tourist poster for the city.</li><li>• Use aerial photographs to compare Tyne and Wear in the UK with Germany in Europe.</li><li>• Describe the positions of Gateshead in the UK with Hamburg in Germany using the 8 compass points.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Locate places on a map.</li><li>• Locate major cities of Germany.</li><li>• Describe key human and physical characteristics of Germany.</li><li>• Use atlases to find data about Germany.</li><li>• Use and recognise atlas symbols.</li></ul>
