Century	100 years
Coal	Black rock that when burned gives off heat.
Collier	A coal miner or a ship that transported coal.
Colliery	A coal mine where they dig for coal.
Dilly line	A wagonway that took the coal from the mine to the staiths at Bill Quay.
Factory	A place where products are made.
Industry	Businesses that provide the same goods.
General Store	A shop that sells a selection of things.
Quay	A structure built along the river used as a landing for loading and unloading boats.
Shipyards	A place where ships are built or repaired.
Source	Information that provides us with first-hand accounts of the past.
Staith	A landing place for boats and ships along the river to load and unload coal.
