Asylum Seeker	A person who has fled their country and applies for asylum in another one.
Commonwealth	The countries that were once part of the British Empire.
Migrant	A person who moves from one place to live in another.
Migration	The movement of people from one place to another.
Persecution	When someone is treated badly because of the race, religion or political beliefs.
Population	The number of people living in a place.
Pull factor	The factors that attract someone to a place.
Push factor	The factors that push people out of a place.
Refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country.
Refugee camp	A temporary settlement to house refugees.
Settlement	A place where people live.
Urban area	A built up area such as a town or city.
Windrush generation	People who came from the Caribbean to the UK after World War 2.
