Pesach Passover – Festival celebrating the Exodus from Egypt.

Seder – A meal that happens at home during passover.

Hagadah – A book used at Pesach

Matzah – Flat bread like crackers.

Charoset – An apple paste

Zeroah – Roasted bone to remind Jewish People of the original offering.

Beitzah – hard boiled egg

Exodus – When Israelites left Egypt Under the rule of Moses

Moses – A prophet who wrote the original Torah.
