Things to Practice at Home



We continue to spend a lot of time outdoors so it is very useful if the children can put on their own coat independently by practicing this at home. We would also like you to encourage your children to put on their own socks and shoes which will be good practice for them in preparation for our PE sessions where the children take off their shoes.



We self-register every morning so please continue to encourage and give your child the opportunity to recognise their own name (lower case letters).

As always, encouraging your child to become more toilet independent is an important skill. We all progress and develop differently and accidents do happen, but we encourage a 'have a go' approach, especially when wiping themselves. Of course, we are always on hand to help children.
