



# Summer Term Year 4

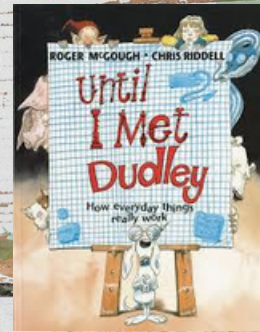
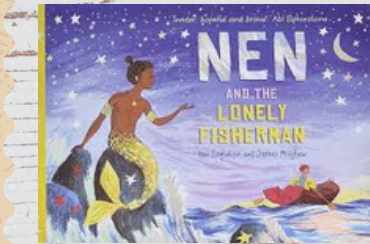
## English

We will continue to practise all of the learning from the autumn and spring terms too, particularly methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. ## Year 4

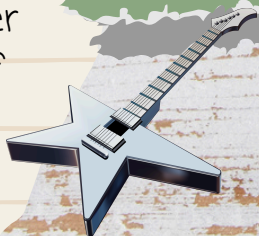
### Multiplication Check

## Humanities

In our history unit, we will learn about Mayan civilisation. In geography, we will look at natural resources and examine the impact that water has on our lives.

On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> June, we will hold our annual TTRS Rock Star Day. Come dressed as a rock star and be prepared to thrash those times tables!



## Science

In our first topic is 'Sound', during which we will learn how sounds are made, and find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it. Our second topic is 'Living Things and their Habitats'. We will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in our environment.



## Art

Our art unit is 'Shape/Pattern' and we will look at the work of Eduardo Kobra and Steve Lohman. We will focus on street art as a stimulus for our drawing, painting and sculpture.



## PE

PE days for the first half-term are Tuesday (fundamentals) and Thursday (fitness). After the May half-term, we will start swimming lessons on Tuesday afternoons at Heworth Leisure Centre. More details about this will be given nearer the time.



## RE

We will return to Buddhism and consider how Buddha's teachings affect how Buddhists live. In our final unit, we will consider the importance of the place of worship for different faiths.
