



Year 2 Summer Term

English

In our writing lessons, we will grow to use a range of punctuation for different types of sentences in a range of fiction and non-fiction writing. We will also be looking to extend our vocabulary by making deliberate word choices and extending our sentences with more detail.

We will understand the specific layout and features of non-fiction texts, poetry and diary writing.

We are reading...



Science

Our topics this term are 'Living things and their habitats'. We will learn about different habitats and what they offer to the plants and animals that live there. We will also look at what plants need in order to survive.

Maths

We will be focusing on the following areas this term: Measures; including length & height, Mass, Capacity & Temperature and Time. We will also look at Statistics and Fractions. Children will develop the recall of the 3 times table. The children will continue to access the Mastery Maths program daily, to strengthen their knowledge and understand of how to tackle word problems.

Humanities

One topic this term is 'Our Street', where the children will learn about the human and physical features in our local community. This topic will focus on our Geographical skills. Children will conduct fieldwork, surveys and look closely at our community. We will then compare how we use the seaside today and how this has changed over time. The children will develop a knowledge of the significance of Grace Darling.



PE

This term we will explore cricket and athletics, developing our understanding for fitness. For the first half-term, PE days are **Monday** and **Wednesday**. Children should come to school in their PE kit.

Computing



This term we develop our knowledge and understanding of programming. We will use VEX123 to follow routes and maps linked to 'Our Street'. We will then look at using technology to make and edit our own music.

RE

Children will explore the range of beliefs, including the choice not to believe in a higher power or religion. We will then compare two religions and how they show their commitment to God.



Music

In music, children will focus on rhythm and blues, looking at a wide range of artists. Then focus on Seaside-themed music made by the composer Debussy and the pianist Einaudi.

Art and DT

Children will follow the design and make process to make a fully-functioning umbrella. We will develop skills and techniques using clay, to make a range of sculptures.

PSHE

In PSHE, our focus is what can help us grow and stay healthy. We will then take a look and recognising our feelings and how we can develop and regulate the range of emotions we experience.
